Ports of Call

EDINBURGH (LEITH), SCOTLAND

One of Europe's most attractive cities, Edinburgh is a marvelous mix of elegant streets, charming squares and quaint alleyways. The city's most distinctive landmark is Edinburgh Castle, set high up on a craggy cliff in the center of the city.

INVERGORDON, SCOTLAND

Invergordon, a harbor in northern Scotland, has long been recognized for its rich naval history. Northern Scotland, known as the Highlands, is one of the most scenic places in Europe, a landscape of mountains and forested hills. Venture into the Highlands where the local clan castles perch on craggy hills.

KIRKWALL (ORKNEY ISLANDS), SCOTLAND

Kirkwall is the principal harbor and capital of Orkney. Steep-roofed stone houses line streets that wind around the medieval St. Magnus Cathedral. A museum featuring Orkney historical artifacts is housed in the 16th-century Tankerness House. Other attractions around the island include Maes Howe, the site of Britain's best-preserved megalithic tomb, and the Stone Age village of Skara Brae. Scapa Flow serves as a reminder of more recent times when, during both World Wars, Britain's naval base was located here.

PORTREE (ISLE OF SKYE), SCOTLAND

Portree, the enchanting capital of the Isle of Skye on Scotland's west coast, is a scenic harbor town fringed with cliffs. One of the town's attractions is the Àros centre which celebrates the island's Gaelic heritage. Other highlights are Dunvegan Castle, a fortress stronghold that has been home to the MacLeods since the 13th century and is believed to be the oldest inhabited castle in Britain.

BELFAST, NORTHERN IRELAND

Discover this city of ornate Victorian and Edwardian architecture, gracious gardens and friendly pubs. See the natural phenomenon of the Giants' Causeway, a stunning geological anomaly of tightly packed, uneven basalt columns disappearing into the sea.

DUBLIN, IRELAND

Cosmopolitan Dublin is the capital and largest city in Ireland. Visit historic Trinity College and gaze at the magnificently decorated Book of Kells. See Georgian mansions on Merrion Square, tour majestic St. Patrick's Cathedral and stroll through lovely St. Stephen's Green.

WATERFORD, IRELAND

Waterford is the fifth largest city in Ireland, and its oldest. Stroll through this 1100-year-old city and admire Reginald's Tower, the oldest urban civic building in Ireland, and the oldest monument to retain its Viking name. To this day, it remains Waterford's most recognizable landmark. Today, Waterford is known for Waterford Crystal, a legacy of the city's former glass making industry. Glass, or crystal, was manufactured in the city from 1783 until early 2009.

CORK (COBH), IRELAND

Cheerful Cork sprawls about the River Lee in one of Ireland's most stunning settings. Bridges crisscross the city leading to landmarks like St. Anne's Church and the Old City Gaol, where you'll see the 19th-century prisoners' graffiti. Consider traveling to Blarney Castle to kiss the legendary Blarney Stone.

FOWEY, ENGLAND

With a rich seafaring history dating back to the 14th century, Fowey in Cornwall is still one of England's busiest ports. Stroll the esplanade, visit St. Fimbarrus Church and admire the view from St. Catherine's Castle, built during the reign of King Henry VIII.

In each port of call you may select from a variety of optional shore excursions for an additional charge, some of which are referenced in the descriptions above.
